Additional information.

In mid June north east Romanian areas suffered violent rainstorms thus there are additional expenses for emergency repairs to RCHF center after roof blown off and 2 dwellings also damaged in the village.

At the end of June a river bank broke loose after heavy storms and a wall of water hit residential dwellings in Dorohoi town in Botosani County and funds have been used to provide emergency aid to the many residents who's homes were destroyed by the severe flooding. This aid includes fresh water supplies, basic food supplies and fresh fruit to affected families, treats for children affected by flooding, plastic sheeting, buckets, mops, disinfectants, detergents, disposable drinking cups and plates plus disposable cutlery to name but a few items. RCHF also via its Dutch office supplied clothing for flood victims and toys and teddy bears for children affected by the flooding.
